Pianist and pedagogue Janet Scott Hoyt has a wealth of experience on the concert stage and in the teaching studio. She is a graduate of the University of Alberta and completed further studies in Europe and at the Banff Centre. A Professor Emeritus of the University of Alberta, she taught there from 1998-2014. During this time she served as Associate Chair for Undergraduate Studies and supervised a graduate program in Piano Pedagogy. A highly regarded teacher, she won the prestigious "Rutherford Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching" in 2011. A highly sought-after collaborative pianist, Ms. Scott Hoyt enjoyed a long association with The Banff Centre where she was Head of the Collaborative Pianist Faculty for many years. Over the course of her career, she has performed across Canada, the United States and in Europe. Among her performances are premières of works by Violet Archer, Srul Irving Glick, Malcolm Forsyth and Oskar Morawetz. A recent CD project teamed her with violinist Martin Riseley to record the three Brahms Sonatas for piano and violin. Previous recordings have featured collaborations with husband David Hoyt and violinist Erika Raum, with cellist Tanya Prochazka and oboist Lidia Khaner.
